### Welcome by Paul Butler, LVSC Chair

Paul welcomed all delegates to the AGM and briefly ran through the agenda.

### 1 LVSC Review 2014-15 by Eithne Rynne, LVSC Chief Executive

Eithne started off by acknowledging the tenacity and resilience of the sector, particularly at this time of great change. She said the sector had risen to the challenges and continued to deliver services. She referred to LVSC's own funding challenges and how the organisation is looking at services that can be delivered within the funding constraints.

Eithne highlighted the work that LVSC has done in the last year by referring to the case studies included in the delegate pack. She also mentioned the LVSC membership form in the delegate pack and encouraged delegates to sign up for the free membership package.

LVSC is also looking at sustainability. The NCVO Change and Financial Sustainability Report, together with the support that City Bridge Trust is giving for corporate engagement work, means there will be resources we can share within the business sector that we can all benefit from.

Eithne emphasised the range of activities that LVSC had carried out during the year. Examples of these were shown in the case studies and Eithne read out comments received from The 999 Club and Hammersmith and Fulham CAB about the service they had received.

LVSC's e-comms has risen dramatically. The reach extended to 118 e-bulletins sent to over 8,000 people. The ability to consult with the VCS is central to the work we do and offers an opportunity to share views and expertise with us. Consultations were carried out on the Social Care Act and the MoPAC Hate Crime Act.

The PEACe HR Service has provided 650 hours of telephone advice and consultancy. The LEAH case study was an example of the excellent training and on-going support provided.

Eithne ended the review by saying she is very proud of the staff team and the way they dealt with the changes they have faced over the last year, particularly their fortitude in embracing new ways of working. It is a small, but robust and dedicated team. She also thanked the Trustees for the unfailing amount of time they have given to support her and the team and their help with the new strategic plan.

Finally, looking forward, Eithne said that funders continue to invest in LVSC and welcome our role as a conduit between themselves and VCS. We also eagerly await the findings of the City Bridge Trust report funded by London Councils. LVSC pledges more learning, sharing and opportunities to develop partnerships.

Paul thanked Eithne, the staff team and his fellow trustees.

# 3 Annual report and financial statements for the year ending 31 March 2015 presented by Ashok Shah, Ash & Co Accountants Ltd

Eithne summarised LVSC's main activity as detailed in the annual report. Ashok presented the accounts for the year to 31st March 2014, highlighting that:

- a) Chantrey Vellacott DFK LLP have merged with Moore Stephens LLP.
- b) Incoming resources from generated funds totalled £890,272, a reduction on last year's figure of £1,879,166.
- c) There is a £138K deficit which will be funded from reserves of £194K.
- d) Total funds carried forward amounts to £194,400.

Malcolm Cadman, Pepys Community Forum asked if LVSC had an Investment Policy. Ashok responded that deposits are kept in long-term accounts as shown in the accounts and LVSC cannot look to tie up income for more than 90 days.

There were no further questions from the audience.
